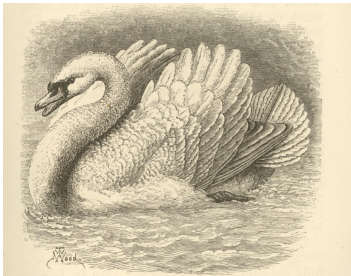


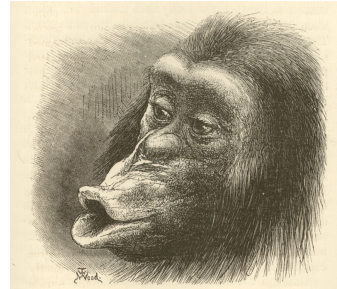
Charles Darwin's "The Expression of the Emotions in Man and Animals"

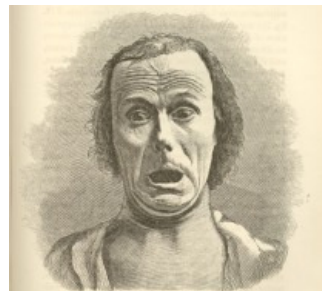

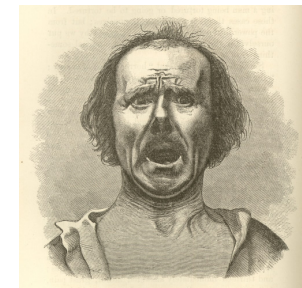
Disgusted Woman
